§ 1

Verweis auf weitere Regelungen

Diese Studienordnung enthält die verbindlichen wesentlichen Regelungen für ein ordnungsgemäßes Studium des Studiengangs International Management in Verbindung mit dem Besonderen Teil der Prüfungsordnung dieses Studiengangs, der Ordnung über die Sprachmodule der Fakultät Wirtschafts- und Sozialwissenschaften sowie dem Allgemeinen Teil der Prüfungsordnung der Hochschule Osnabrück. Sie legt Aufbau und Inhalt des Studiengangs verbindlich fest, insbesondere die Modulbezeichnungen, deren Semesterlage, die Anzahl der Prüfungsleistungen, die zur Auswahl stehenden Prüfungsarten und die Leistungspunkte.

§ 2

Art und Umfang der Prüfungen

- (1) Art und Anzahl der benoteten und unbenoteten Prüfungsleistungen sowie die zugehörigen Prüfungsanforderungen des ersten Studienabschnitts sind in der Anlage 1 festgelegt.
- (2) Art und Anzahl der benoteten und unbenoteten Prüfungsleistungen sowie die zugehörigen Prüfungsanforderungen des zweiten Studienabschnitts sind in der Anlage 2 festgelegt.
- (3) Art und Anzahl der benoteten und unbenoteten Prüfungsleistungen sowie die zugehörigen Prüfungsanforderungen für das optionale Angebot an Schwerpunkten für den Bachelorstudiengang International Management sind in der Anlage 3 festgelegt.

§ 3

Auslandsstudiensemester

¹Für ein Auslandsstudiensemester können je nach Lehrangebot der Partnerhochschule, gemäß Learning Agreement (LA) mehrere Module zusammengefasst und als Paket anerkannt werden. ²Soweit die einzelnen Noten umrechenbar sind, werden bei dieser Vorgehensweise Durchschnittsnoten aus den eingerechneten Teilleistungen gebildet.

- ²⁾ The portfolio exam PFP-1 covers 100 points and consists of two written examinations (30 minutes each), one presentation (PR) and one oral examination (M). Each element is weighted by 25 points (25 percent). (Individual parts: K30 + K30 + PR + M; points: 25 + 25 + 25 + 25).

The portfolio exam PFP-2 covers 100 points and consists of one written examination (K1) and one oral examination (M). Each element is weighted by 50 points (50 percent). (Individual parts: K1 + M; points: 50 + 50).

Portfolio exam for Chinese level A1:

The portfolio exam PFP-1 covers 100 points and consists of two written examinations (30 minutes each), one presentation (PR) and one oral examination (M). Each written examination is weighted by 30 points (30 percent). The presentation and the oral examination are weighted by 20 points (20 percent) each. (Individual parts: K30 + K30 + PR + M; points: 30 + 30 + 20 + 20).

The portfolio exam PFP-2 covers 100 points and consists of one written examination (K1), one presentation (PR) and one oral examination (M). The written examination is weighted by 50 points (50 per cent). The presentation and the oral examination are weighted by 25 points (25 percent) each. (Individual parts: K1 + PR + M; points: 50 + 25 + 25).

Portfolio exam for Russian level A2:

PFP-1: The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written examination (K1) and one oral examination (M). K1 and M are weighted by 50 points (50 percent) each.

PFP-2: The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written paper (HA) and one presentation (PR) HA and PR are weighted by 50 points (50 percent) each.

PFP-3: The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of two written examinations (30 minutes each) and two oral examinations (M). The individual parts are weighted by 25 points (25 percent) each.

Portfolio exam for Spanish level B1:

The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of two written examinations (40 minutes each), one presentation (PR) and one oral examination (M). Each K40 is weighted by 25 points (25 percent). PR is weighted by 30 points (30 percent) and M is weighted by 20 points (20 percent).

- ³⁾ As a rule, students will only be admitted to the module "Business Mathematics" if they have passed either the placement test or the preparatory course mathematics.
- ⁴⁾ As a rule, students will only be admitted to a level of a foreign language course if they have passed the preceding course level (prerequisite) or if their initial placement test has shown the relevant results. Students can select their

foreign business language from the following offer: Chinese, French, Spanish, Russian. International students (i.e. students who have obtained their school leaving certificate or university degree abroad) choose German if they do not have proven study competence (level B2 CEF) in German by means of one of the internationally recognised language certificates (e. g. by Goethe institute). Other languages can be taken as additional languages if they are necessary for the partner university to study abroad and/or replace the aforementioned on application and subject to approval by the Academic Dean. If Chinese or Russian is chosen, only the modules on level A1 (Chinese) or A2 (Russian) have to be completed. International students take German on level B1.1.

- 5) There are no admission requirements for the module "Financial Statements (IFRS)".
- 6) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one report (R) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The report and the examination are weighted by 50 points each.
- 7) The portfolio exam covers 120 points and consists of a one-hour written examination (K1) and a final one-hour written examination (K1). Each K1 is weighted by 60 points.
- 8) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one presentation (PR) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The presentation and the examination are weighted by 50 points each.
- 9) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written paper (HA) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The written paper and the examination are weighted by 50 points each.
- 10) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consist of one written project report (PSC) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The project report and the examination are weighted by 50 points each.
- 11) The portfolio exam covers 120 points and consists of one presentation (PR) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The presentation and the examination are weighted by 60 points each.

- 1) The examiner selects one competence-oriented type of examination.
- 2) The specialisation covers three modules with 5 ECTS credits each. Students choose their specialisation from the offer mentioned below. Module 1 and Module 2 of the specialisation are regularly completed at Osnabrueck University of Applied Sciences, Module 3 is completed abroad.
- 3) In accordance with the course offer of the (partner) university abroad.
- 4) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one presentation (PR) and one written paper (HA). The presentation is weighted by 60 Points and the written paper is weighted by 40 points.
- 5) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and includes one written paper (HA) and one written project report (PSC). HA and PSC are weighted by 50 points each.
- 6) Module 3 of the Specialisation, which is individually selected from the offer mentioned below, is completed in the semester abroad. Students choose a module supplementing the contents of the specialisation selected according to the offer of the foreign university.
- 7) The Electives Abroad shall be advanced modules from the field of business management / economics according to the students' choice and offer of the foreign university. Students who have chosen a Business Language as their specialisation at Osnabrück University of Applied Sciences have to choose specific modules of one discipline in business management or economics (for example in the field of "Marketing"). Students who have chosen a specialisation in the field of business management or economics at Osnabrück University of Applied Sciences can select modules under the electives abroad in an interdisciplinary manner.
- 8) Regular participation in two block seminars at the students' option. At least one block seminar has to be of the kind "international". The regular participation in an International Summer University abroad that is credited with 5 ECTS

credits replaces the participation in two block seminars. Alternatively, a module that is comparable in terms of learning objectives and that is credited with 5 ECTS credits can be recognized, e.g. the International Summer University (ISU) at Osnabrück University of Applied Sciences.

- 9) The number of contact hours per week varies.
- 10) The number of contact hours per week varies according to the individual consultation per student.
- 11) The „Internship and Academic Project“ is a compulsory internship with duration of 12 weeks. The internship can exceptionally be a practical project work to be agreed with the examiner.
- 12) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of a one-hour written examination (K1) and a final one-hour written examination (K1). Each K1 is weighted by 50 points.
- 13) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written paper (HA) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The written paper and the examination are weighted by 50 points each.
- 14) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written project report (PSC) and one presentation with written report (R). PSC is weighted by 40 points and R is weighted by 60 points.
- 15) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one report (R) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The report and the examination are weighted by 50 points.
- 16) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one presentation (PR) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The presentation and the examination are weighted by 50 points each.
- 17) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of an experimental exercise (EA) and a one-hour written examination (K1). EA and K1 are weighted by 50 points each.

Organisation of semester 5 (semester abroad):

As a rule, semester 5 is scheduled as the study semester abroad and is compulsory for both German students and students who have obtained their higher education entry qualification in Germany as well as foreign students. Level B2 of the language of instruction at the chosen foreign university has to be completed as an admission requirement. Foreign students may be allowed to spend this semester at Hochschule Osnabrück if a substantiated application to that effect is submitted and if they prove to be sufficiently competent in German.

During their study semester abroad at a partner or non-partner university, students need to select modules with a credit point value to the equivalent of 25 ECTS credits altogether. In their semester abroad, students complete electives covering 20 ECTS credits as well as the third module of their individually selected specialisation covering 5 ECTS credits.

The Electives Abroad covering 20 ECTS credits shall be advanced modules from the field of business management or economics (including modules relating to social and cultural sciences) according to the students' choice and offer of the foreign university. Students who have chosen a Business Language as their specialisation at Osnabrück University of Applied Sciences have to choose specific modules of one discipline in business management or economics (for example in the field of "Marketing") to the extent of approximately 15 ECTS credits (equalling a specialisation) from the overall 20 ECTS credits which have to be completed. Students who have chosen a specialisation in the field of business management or economics at Osnabrück University of Applied Sciences can select all the modules under the electives abroad in an interdisciplinary manner.

The third module of the Specialisation, which is individually selected by the students at Osnabrück University of Applied Sciences, is completed in the semester abroad. Students choose a module supplementing the contents of the specialisation selected according to the offer of the foreign university. 5 ECTS credits are allocated to this specialisation module by Osnabrueck University of Applied Sciences.

The modules to be completed in the semester abroad are to be agreed with the Faculty and fixed in a Learning Agreement. As a minimum requirement, 20 ECTS credits have to be obtained abroad for the study semester abroad being regarded as passed.

Exceptions to the above regulations may be granted by the Dean of Studies.

2) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one presentation (PR) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The presentation and the examination are weighted by 50 points each.

3) The portfolio exam consists of 100 points and consists of a one-hour written examination (K1) and a final one-hour written examination (K1). Each K1 is weighted by 50 points.

4) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and includes one written paper (HA) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The written paper and the examination are weighted by 50 points each.

5) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and includes one written paper (HA) and one presentation (PR). HA is weighted by 70 points and PR is weighted by 30 points.

6) The portfolio exam covers 120 points and consists of one presentation (PR) and a one-hour written examination (K1). The presentation and the examination are weighted by 60 points each.

- 7) The portfolio exam consists of 120 points and consists of a one-hour written examination (K1) and a final one-hour written examination (K1). Each K1 is weighted by 60 points.
- 8) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written case study (FSS) and one report (R). The written case study is weighted by 70 points and the report is weighted by 30 points.
- 9) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of a one-hour written examination (K1), on presentation (PR) and a written project report (PSC). K1 is weighted by 50 points, PR is weighted by 10 points and PSC is weighted by 40 points.
- 10) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of a presentation (PR) and a written project report (PSC). PR is weighted by 30 and PSC is weighted by 70 points.
- 11) The portfolio exam consists of 100 points and consists of one presentation with written report (R), one multiple-choice examination (AWV), one presentation (PR) and one written paper (HA). R and PR are weighted by 30 points each. AVW and HA are weighted by 20 points each.
- 12) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of a one-hour written examination (K1) and one presentation with written report Referat (R). K1 and R are weighted by 50 points each.
- 13) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written exam (K20) and one written exam (K90), one written work samle (APS) and one presentation (PR). K20 is weighted by 10 points. K90 is weighted by 50 points. APS is weighted by 15 points. PR is weighted by 25 points.
- 14) Portfolio exam for Chinese level A2.1:
 PFP-1: The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of two written examination (30 minutes), one presentation (PR) and one oral examination (M). The written examinations are weighted by 30 points each. PR and M are weighted by 20 points each.
 PFP-2: The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written examination (K1), one presentation (PR) and one oral examination (M). The written examination is weighted by 50 points. PR and M are weighted by 25 points each.
- 15) Portfolio exam for Russian level B1 and B 2.1:
 PFP-1: The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written examination (K1) and one oral examination (M). K1 and M are weighted by 50 points (50 percent) each.
 PFP-2: The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written paper (HA) and one presentation (PR) HA and PR are weighted by 50 points (50 percent) each.
- 16) Portfolio exam for Spanish level B2:
 The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of two written examinations (40 minutes each), one presentation (PR) and one oral examination (M). Each K40 is weighted by 25 points (25 percent). PR is weighted by 30 points (30 percent) and M is weighted by 20 points (20 percent).
- 17) Another optional module in Logistics which is taught in English can be chosen alternatively.
- 18) Another optional module in Event Management which is taught in English can be chosen alternatively.
- 19) Portfolio exam for Spanish level C 1.1:
 The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one presentation (PR), one oral examination (M), one written work example (APS) and one written examinations (K1). PR and M are weighted by 25 points (25 percent). APS is weighted by 20 points (20 percent) and K1 is weighted by 30 points (30 percent).
- 20) The portfolio exam covers 100 points and includes one written paper (HA) and a one-hour written case study (FSS). The written case study and the examination are weighted by 50 points each.
- 21) Portfolio exam for Chinese level A2.2:
 PFP-1: The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written examination (K20), written examination (K90 minutes), one presentation (PR) and one oral examination (M). K20 is weighted by 10 points, K90 is weighted by 50 points. PR is weighted by 15 points and M is weighted by 25 points.
 PFP-2: The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one written examination (K20), written examination (K90 minutes) and one presentation (PR). K20 is weighted by 20 points, K90 is weighted by 60 points and PR is weighted by 20 points.
- 22) Portfolio exam for French level B2 and C1.1: The portfolio exam covers 100 points and consists of one presentation (PR), one oral examination (M), one written work example (APS) and one written examinations (K1). PR and M are weighted by 25 points (25 percent). APS is weighted by 20 points (20 percent) and K1 is weighted by 30 points.
- 23) PFP-3: The portfolio exam covers 120 points and consists of two written examination (40 minutes) and one presentation (PR). The written examinations and PR are weighted by 40 points each.
